

Checklist for Registering a Boat in Poland (EU Citizen, Buying in the EU)

1 Boat Documents
 □ Bill of Sale or VAT Invoice (proof of ownership, preferably in Polish or English) □ Previous Registration Certificate (if the boat was previously registered) □ CE Certificate (required for boats manufactured after 1998) □ Hull Identification Number (HIN/WIN) – required for boats produced after 1998 □ Declaration of Conformity (CE Compliance Document) (confirming the boat meets Elestandards)
2 Proof of Tax Payments (VAT, Customs – if applicable)
 If the boat is new and purchased in the EU: Invoice with VAT included or proof of VAT payment in the country of purchase
 If the boat is used and comes from the EU: Document confirming previous registration in the EU (e.g., old registration certificate) No VAT payment required in Poland, if VAT was already paid in another EU country
 If the boat was imported from outside the EU (e.g., USA, Switzerland): Customs Clearance Document (SAD – Single Administrative Document) Proof of Customs Duty and VAT Payment
③Owner's Documents (EU Citizen)
 □ Passport or National ID Card □ Address of Residence in the EU □ Taxpayer Identification Number (if required by the country of residence) □ Power of Attorney (if the registration is handled by an agent or company)
4 Technical Documents
 □ Boat Specifications (length, width, displacement, engine power) □ Engine Documentation (serial number, year of manufacture, power output) □ Technical Inspection Certificate (if required for a specific type of boat)
